Officers pause to remember Officer David J. Tolsma

CHEEKTOWAGA – Cheektowaga Police officers assigned to the afternoon shift Friday paused for a moment of silence to remember Officer David J. Tolsma who was killed in the line of duty 40 years ago.

His brothers in blue gathered by Officer Tolsma's memorial inside police headquarters as part of their afternoon briefing.

Officer Tolsma was shot and killed while responding to a holdup alarm inside a hotel on Genesee Street around 1:00 am on October 20, 1977. He was 32-years-old.

A six-year veteran of the department, he left behind his wife, Judith, and two children, Kimberly and Jason.

Tolsma Place, a street off Sonwil Drive, was named in his honor by the town in 2007, and the police firearms training facility on Scott Street is named after Tolsma and Robert
