He joined the department in August 1990 after a short period with the New York State Police.

When he wasn't escorting US Presidents or on special detail with the department's Bike Patrol Unit, Officer Heisler served the residents of Cheektowaga in the patrol division – a majority of his time spent on the afternoon shift.
