7:20 am – Around five cars at Losson Garden Apartments were vandalized. They had their mirrors smashed.

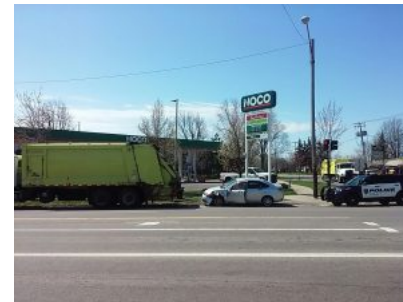
10:04 am – A town sanitation truck and Ford Focus collided on Borden Road.
