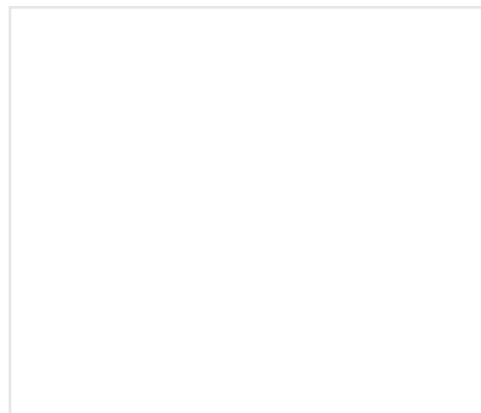
## **Lackawanna School District announces free meals to all students**
